A reading from Letter of Paul to the Galatians

“The only thing I want to learn from you is this: Did you receive the Spirit by doing the works of the law or by believing what you heard? Are you so foolish? Having started with the Spirit, are you now ending with the flesh?”

Are you the type of a person when you have an idea, go out and try to get it done? Or are you the type of person who has an idea, thinks about it, and figures the way to get it done? Do you remember when you were young, and the faith you practiced was exciting and new. For example, remember when your first learned how to read. You were excited and wanted to read more or kicked your first soccer ball you wanted to keep running. As you got older, you realized reading was more than fantastical stories with pictures, and soccer became about training and maximizing scoring potential, or worse, realizing you were a good player, but not elite. You may have noticed you lost that initial feeling of excitement. This is what St. Paul tells us about our faith in God.

Each of us, within our respected faith traditions, used to behold it in wonder and awe. We had a desire to know more and practice the customs and traditions with a fervent heart and devotion. I know I'm guilty of this, as well as my fellow Catholics, were the traditions and customs become stagnate and common. Prayer life becomes dry and faith wains to only be replaced by bitterness, anger and cynicism. But St. Paul reminds us to never lose that wonder and awe. Never stop delving into your faith in God. Don't trade in your faith for the worldly things of this world. Do not give into despair and cynicism of this world. Instead, keep the faith.

I pray each of you in your respected faith keep digging and practicing for when we do this, we will always find we have more common and find better paths to peace and prosperity for it is rooted in love of God above all else.
