A reading from the Gospel of Luke

Jesus said to His Apostles, “Who among you would say to your slave who has just come in from ploughing or tending sheep in the field, “Come here at once and take your place at the table”? Would you not rather say to him, “Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink”? Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded? So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, “We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!” ’



Has anyone ever told you, ‘you can do better?’ You are better than this test or paper. You are better than your mistake or decision. More than likely, you have heard this more than once in your life. Sometimes, you were angry at the person or disappointed in yourself. Whatever the reaction, the truth remains. We can always improve and do better in our life, and more importantly, in our relationship with God.

Why is that important? God created us to daily grow in faith, wisdom, and love. God wants more than mediocrity and just enough for us. Instead, God wants to lavish His creation with every blessing.
