DAILY REFLECTION

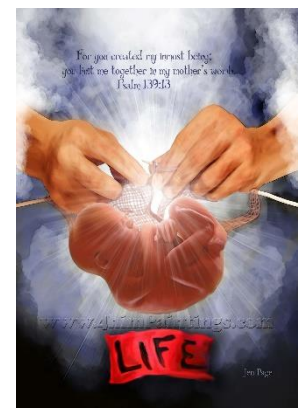
In the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Dear God, we acknowledge that the land on which we gather is part of the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians

“Do you not know that you are God’s temple and that God’s Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God’s temple, God will destroy that person. For God’s temple is holy, and you are that temple.”

Some of us have lived lives which have wounded our hearts. Our experiences with others may cause us not to trust others or believe and love ourselves. For others, some cannot believe that God made them and loves them. These experiences are genuine and its effects have long-lasting repercussions. Yet, today, St. Paul writes to you. He wants to remind you that what God has created is good because you stem from His love.



This scripture passage always strikes me. It reminds me that even in my shortcomings and sin, God loves me. God calls me to protect His creation, his Creation which also includes me. This is earth shattering news. This helps me to see my life through God's eyes. I am not only made from God's love, but He has entrusted me to take care of it. More than the earth, from the dust to the sky, God trusts me to protect what is holy and true and if anyone violates my dignity, God in his time, mercy, and justice, will make right who was wronged.

Let us pray for those whose dignity someone has tainted or wounded beyond human repair. May God's grace be upon them to see God is with them, even when they cannot see him. Let them find hope in God's love and mercy to restore what they lost and remember, they are always good in God's eyes, because in his grace, God sanctifies and blesses with the seal of His love on our hearts. Let us keep in our prayers all who are fighting for what is right and just in our community, and in every corner of the world, especially in Iran and Ukraine.
