I remember a time when I had to solve for X in a mathematical equation on a math test. I had isolated x, and the steps were all correct. The equation was: $x=1-1$. The next step would be $x = 0$. I wrote $x=1$. Obviously, the answer is $x=0$ because $1-1$ is 0, and I lost a mark. As funny as it sounds and embarrassing when I received the test back, it serves as an example of how the answer is obvious and we are still blind to see it.
