For Catholic Education Week, St. Teresa of Avila School activities will be designed in all classrooms to highlight the unique role our faith plays in our understanding of the curriculum. Students and staff will celebrate liturgies and the Crowning of Mary.

Faith Formation:

Forming ourselves in our Catholic faith is a foundational element in helping each of us understand and live in the example of Christ.

School activities that support both adult and student faith formation include:

- Breakfast Club for students (daily)
- Faith in Action students providing acts of service
- GOTCHA awards to recognize acts of kindness
- Social Justice Activities (food drives/life essential drives) organized by the Adult Faith Ambassadors
- Staff Liturgies/Reflections monthly as well as during Advent and Lent-virtually
- School wide Opening Mass, Advent Mass, Lenten Mass and End of Year Mass
- Book of Life displayed during the month of November with names of passed loved ones entered by both students and staff for prayer intentions.
- School wide Remembrance Day Service-virtual
- Sacred spaces in each class for individual prayer and as a focus for class celebrations.
- Staff focus on faith life of the school at monthly staff meetings.
- Staff PD opportunities, "When Faith Meets Pedagogy," religion in-services.
- Daily Religious Education and Family Life Education
- Sacramental Preparation in Grades 2 and 7
- Stations of the Cross- if we can
- Students complete Lenten Promises and are taught to reflect and carry out the promises

Sacramental Preparation:

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

The virtues of faith, respect, empathy, kindness, conscience, love, hope, acceptance, self-control and fairness are always visible within our school. We draw upon the virtues to celebrate successes and as a tool during progressive discipline.

At St. Teresa of Avila, the virtues are present in all of our actions as a school community. They are referenced daily, whether it is through prayer or a curriculum connection. School Masses and Liturgies are two areas where our virtues come to life within our school community.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

At St. Teresa of Avila we have many visible signs of our faith in our classrooms, hallways and common areas:

These visible signs include:

- Display cases
- A sacred space, crosses and pictures representing our faith are visible in all classrooms
- We also have a wooden altar and cross in the front foyer, which is clearly visible and reflects the Liturgical Seasons of the Year.
- Virtue of the Month is displayed on the bulletin board. Faith events and activities are highlighted in classroom calendars and school newsletters.
- Saint Feast days are included in our daily prayer. Daily announcements include Gospel and Bible readings.
