Recognizing Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations:

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring

family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

To celebrate the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations, we as a school faith community participate in Virtue Assemblies, as well as referring to the elementary school version of the Expectations.
We honour our Grade 8 graduates by giving awards to students who exemplify each of the OCSGE.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

Christian Virtues are celebrated and emphasized throughout our school community through monthly virtue assemblies, where virtuous behaviours are prayed for and celebrated by staff, students and parents. Students receive a “virtue bracelet” when they receive a virtue award. Virtues are emphasized and taught throughout the curriculum, as well as reflected/reviewed in discipline and conflict resolution when addressing behaviours at school. All Virtue assemblies during the 2021-2022 school year will take place virtually.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God’s love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.


