As we complete our final preparations for return to school on Tuesday, September 6, I want to first give you a big welcome on behalf of all DPCDSB staff. We look forward to seeing your children and to meeting parents and guardians in person after two plus years of operating in a pandemic environment.

While we will still maintain many of the health and safety protocols that have been in place, we will strive to ensure that students are provided with as many opportunities as possible to experience the full educational experience, including many of the extra-curricular activities, i.e., clubs, athletics, etc., that are so essential to promoting student well-being.

This Bulletin outlines a few broad key reminders and updates. More information will come forward to you, both centrally from the Board, and locally from your child(ren)'s school(s).

May God bless you, your children, and your family throughout the upcoming school year as we all work together to provide you and your children with an extraordinary Catholic education experience!

HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS – DPCDSB continues to promote measures to enhance health and safety in schools including:

- ➔ **Daily self-screening** - It is recommended that staff, students and visitors continue to self-screen every day before attending school using the Province of Ontario's [COVID-19 school and childcare screening tool](#).
- ➔ **Vaccine clinics** – We will share information about vaccine clinics from our community health partners on an ongoing basis.
- ➔ **Masking** – Wearing a mask is optional and a personal choice of the student/staff member. We respect each person's personal choice to wear, or not wear a mask, in this regard. Masks (medical grade and N95) will be available for staff across all DPCDSB schools and non-medical cloth masks will be available for students at all DPCDSB schools.
- ➔ **Take Home Rapid Antigen Tests** - The Ministry will continue to offer access to rapid antigen tests for students and staff, in alignment with [provincial testing guidance](#). The rapid antigen tests will be provided to staff/students upon their request, and/or upon return from an unplanned absence.
- ➔ **Absence Reporting** – DPCDSB schools will continue to track absence rates and communicate information with our regional public health units when these rates increase above 30% of the school's baseline level. If the absence rates cannot be explained by a specific occurrence, such as a holiday/special event, then our regional public health units may provide a letter to inform the school community. The Ministry of Education no longer tracks and posts school absences.

Extraordinary lives start with a great Catholic education.

- **Water Fountains** - There are no longer any restrictions on the use of water fountains, however, individuals are encouraged to use fountains to fill a cup/bottle from which to drink.
- **Communication of Suspected COVID Cases** - DPCDSB will continue to be transparent as it relates to COVID-19 cases, where principals will be required to provide a notification letter to the school community.

VENTILATION IN SCHOOLS

Significant improvements have been made to ventilation and filtration through the implementation of various measures across all DPCDSB schools, including to existing ventilation systems, deployment of standalone HEPA filter units, and upgrades to school ventilation infrastructure. DPCDSB will continue to review ongoing opportunities for investments for upgrades based on available funding from the Ministry of Education.

The Ministry of Education requires all school boards to publicly post standardized ventilation measures report for the 2022-2023 school year as an update to the information originally posted in August 2021. Updated school-level information for all DPCDSB schools is available on the DPCDSB website.

CLASS ASSIGNMENTS

Students in elementary school will receive a message from the school regarding the classroom to which they should report on the first day of school. Elementary remote only students will receive an email from the classroom teacher inviting them to the Learning Management System.

COMMUNICATIONS

It is the practice of DPCDSB to share information with parents/guardians and staff in an open and transparent manner and on an ongoing basis. One of our primary communications delivery methods to parents/guardians is through the SchoolMessenger email broadcast system.
