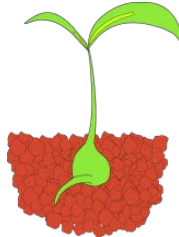


CLASS 27 Age 3 and under

1. One black painted hand print on the center of a disposable plate. No larger than 17cm.
2. A page coloured from your colouring book
3. Decorating a white balloon
4. A collection of 5 cows glued onto a disposable plate, max. 17 cm
5. Print “cows” in red.

CLASS 28 JK and SK

6. A page colored from your coloring book
7. Make a candy necklace or kabob
8. Grow grass seeds in a disposable cup
9. Draw a picture of a cow
10. Hand print “Cows and Plows”
11. Decorate a disposable cup in black and white



CLASS 29 Grades 1 & 2

12. Create a “cow” bank from recycled materials, (maximum size 28cm x 36cm)
13. Draw a picture of a “Cow and a Plow”
14. Use a real seed as the root & draw a picture of the plant that it will grow into, max. 28cm x 36 cm
15. Hand print “Cows and Plows”
16. Make a collage of “Cows and Plows” (maximum 28cm x 36cm)
17. Using small pebbles, create a mini campfire, (max. 22cmX 28cm)

CLASS 30 Grades 3 & 4

BAKING:

18. Bake your favourite cookie and display 3 on a disposable plate.
19. Make S’mores and display 3 on a disposable plate.
20. Make your own trail mix and display in a small, resealable bag
21. Craft a marshmallow “Cow”, displayed on a disposable plate
22. Decorate a hardboiled egg & display it in an egg cup



ARTS AND CRAFTS:

23. Your favorite school project (maximum 1 Bristol board sheet)
24. Create a Christmas ornament out of red, white & green buttons
25. Make/Craft a cushion
26. Dress your teddy bear like a cow
27. Create a “plow” out of duct tape- max 25 cm in any direction
28. Using a child’s building set (Lego, K’nex etc.) create “150”, max. 25 cm in any direction)
29. Craft a friendship bracelet using black and white embroidery floss & buttons & any other craft items
30. Decorate a visor like a cow
31. Any other craft not mentioned (maximum 50 cm in any direction)

UNDERSTANDING AGRICULTURE:

32. Hand print a list of 5 breeds of cows (max. 28cm x 36cm)
33. Draw a picture of cows in a barnyard – label with the breed of cow
34. Create a cow from Kinetic Sand (max. 50cm in any direction)
35. Draw a picture of a plow and label the various parts

CLASS 31 Grades 5 & 6

BAKING:

36. Bake cookies & display 3 on a disposable plate in a sealed, clear; plastic bag
37. Bake and decorate 3 cupcakes displayed on a disposable plate inside a clear bag. No purchased mixes or paper cup liners.
38. Make a treat for a family member displayed in a sealed clear bag.
39. Make your favourite muffins and display 3 on a disposable plate in a sealed, clear; plastic bag
40. Make 3 pieces of fudge displayed on a plate in a sealed clear bag.

ARTS AND CRAFTS:

41. Decorate a pair of running shoes
42. Create a fireworks scene on black construction paper-sparkles and sequins allowed
43. Make a self-supporting “Can-imal”-a farm animal using a minimum of 2 cans. (maximum 22cm x 28cm)
44. Sew pajama pants – attach sample of material
45. Knit or crochet a hat or scarf – attach sample of yarn
46. Using a child’s building set, eg: Lego, K’nex, etc. , create an agricultural scene max. 25 cm in any direction
47. Handprint or cursive write as many words as you can using letters from “Cows and Plows”
48. Hand write/print a playlist of your favourite songs.
49. Any other craft not mentioned (maximum 50 cm in any direction)

UNDERSTANDING AGRICULTURE:

50. Handwrite/print a list of 10 breeds of cows
51. Draw a plow and label the various parts
52. Hand draw/create a bumper sticker for your vehicle, promoting the Bolton Fall Fair
53. Collect 5 different vegetables, label them & display in a basket or on a disposable plate

CLASS 32 Grades 7 & 8

BAKING:

54. Create and hand write a recipe using ingredients that come from a cow. Max. 28 by 36 cm
55. Bake your favourite cookies, display” 3 on a disposable plate inside a clear bag.

56. Strawberry jam in a small sealed jar.
57. Bake brownies and display 3 on a disposable plate inside a clear bag
58. Make a ‘Gift in a Jar’ with labeled instructions attached (Example: cookies, brownies, soup etc.)

ARTS AND CRAFTS:

59. Make/Craft a cushion. Fabric or yarn samples attached.
60. Decorate cut off blue jeans or shorts with black and white to celebrate “Cows and Plows”
61. Make a piece of artwork using melted crayons, max. 25 cm in any direction
62. Make home-made play dough and form it into a cow and a plow displayed on a disposable plate, include the recipe. Maximum 25 cm
63. Make your favourite food on a paper plate using scrap yarn or other craft materials
64. Your favourite school art project.
65. An article knit, crocheted or sewn – attach fabric or yarn sample
66. Handmade jewelry
67. Any other craft not mentioned (maximum 50 cm in any direction)

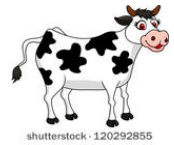
UNDERSTANDING AGRICULTURE:

68. Display 3 photographs that you have taken of Caledon cows or plows
69. Draw a picture and write a few sentences about farm implements of the future
70. Make a “Farmers Feed Cities” sign with seeds or kernels, max 32 cm X 50cm
71. Using old magazines, cut out and create a mismatched farm animal. Max. 3 different animal parts max 32 cm X 50cm

CLASS 33 Grades 9 to 12

BAKING:

72. Bake 3 of your favourite cookies, displayed on a disposable plate in a sealed plastic bag
73. Bake a banana loaf , displayed in a sealed plastic bag
74. “Gift in a Jar” – attach recipe
75. Caramel popcorn in a sealed plastic bag
76. Bake your favourite squares and display 3 in a sealed plastic bag on a disposable plate



ARTS AND CRAFTS:

77. Create a fascinator
78. A page coloured from an adult colouring book
79. Handmade jewelry
80. Make a craft from duct tape(maximum 50 cm in any direction).
81. An article knit, crocheted or sewn – attach fabric or yarn sample
82. Make a dream catcher
83. Make a bird house
84. Draw on a white T-shirt to resemble a Holstein cow
85. Any other craft not mentioned (maximum 50 cm in any direction)

86. Create a vegetable person, animal, bird or insect out of at least 3 different vegetables
87. Create an agricultural scene, using plasticine art displayed inside a CD case
88. List 5 creative themes for future Bolton Fall Fairs
89. Cursive write a list of 10 different Agricultural University programs or courses

CLASS 34 JUNIOR BAKING OPEN CLASS

90. Bake a lemon loaf and display on a disposable plate in a sealed clear, plastic bag
91. Bake your favourite squares and display 3 on a disposable plate in a sealed, clear plastic bag.
92. Cherry jam in a small sealed jar.
93. Bake 3 chocolate chip muffins & display on a disposable plate in a clear, plastic bag. No purchased mixes or paper liners
94. Apple Crisp one serving, displayed in a small glass dish and covered with plastic film
95. Bake and decorate sugar cookies : fair theme- **no mixes**-judged on taste and appearance display 3 on disposable plate in a clear plastic bag
96. Maple fudge, 3 pieces on a disposable plate in a sealed clear plastic bag
97. Salsa, any kind in a small jar, sealed
