**E. Updates/Information/Reports from Trustees for Receipt**

1. Regular Reports

a. Ontario Catholic School Trustees' Association Report – Trustee Shawn Xaviour

The Ontario Catholic School Trustees' Association welcomes the additional education funding in support of early reading interventions, targeted math and additional support for students with disabilities as announced in the 2023 Provincial Budget.

On March 22, the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) launched its School Support Portal.

In 2019, changes were made to Ontario Regulation 246/18 to require all school boards to adopt a trustee code of conduct and make it publicly available. The regulation also requires school boards to review its trustee code of conduct by May 15, 2023 and every fourth year thereafter. The review shall determine if changes to the code are required and make those changes or, if no changes are required, confirm the existing code of conduct.

The OCSTA 2023 Annual General Meeting (AGM) Resolutions have been sent out for trustees to review.

OCSTA is again working with Osgoode Professional Development on a *Human Rights Program* for Catholic trustees, dates will be confirmed once available.

1. Trustee Mario Pascucci: The MPAC launch of the School Support Portal is a good step forward. As the OCSTA Large Boards Representative, I hope to have information following the AGM in April.
2. Trustee Brea Corbet: Trustee Shawn Xaviour, can you provide us with the report so that we may include it in our School Community Newsletters?

Trustee Shawn Xaviour: I will provide it to trustees.

b. Student Voice - Leroy Onuoha (North) and Dea Sokoli (South)

Due to the March Break, we were unable to organize a proper student senate meeting. As such, we have turned to meeting online after school, split into two parts. On March 23, we discussed previous board delegations in order to gain more student voice and input. We observed an overwhelming support for the Indigenous Student Trustee amongst our senators. On March 30 we will meet with students regarding the Right to Life delegation to Ottawa in May. Superintendent Murphy will assist at this planning meeting.

The policy coordinator from Ontario Student Trustees' Association (OSTA-AECO) has requested that our senate members participate in a survey. The survey is on the Ontario grade 9-12 health curriculum and the goal is to identify deficiencies that students may face while learning about living a healthy lifestyle, mentally and physically. We will bring this request forward to the Program Department for review.

1. Retirement - S. Blackmore

**K. Questions Asked of, and by, Trustees**

1. Trustee Bruno Iannicca: How will parents/guardians ask their questions at the Procurement Information Session on Thursday evening?

Executive Superintendent Cherepacha: The community engagement evening *Procurement Information Session* will be a live webcast. The public will be able to enter in their questions and the panel will address questions raised.
2. Trustee Shawn Xaviour: Will this information session be recorded? Can questions be asked after the session?

Executive Superintendent Cherepacha: It will be recorded and available on our LiveStream link. We will provide details of how questions can be submitted following the session.
3. Trustee Bruno Iannicca: May I ask the status of the removal of the Mary Fix CES portapak?

Superintendent Thomas: The removal of the portapak is among a group of schools on our Facilities Project List for the summer of 2024.
4. Trustee Bruno Iannicca: Can staff provide an update of how the elementary student voice is being raised through the secondary Student Senate to the two Student Trustees so that they may bring any issues to the Board of Trustees?

Superintendent Lewis: We continue to work on this and intend to have the process in place for September 2023.

Student Trustee Leroy Onuoha commented that this issue has been raised with the incoming student trustees and is a priority for next year.

5. Trustee Bruno Iannicca: Commented that the Human Trafficking Information evening is on April 27. The flyer should be ready for distribution soon. He advised that he has a community letter ready that he will share with his ward, and he would be pleased to share it with other trustees. This can promote the event until the flyer is ready for distribution.
6. Trustee Herman Vioria: Prior to the new trustees beginning in November a survey was done on Board and Committee Meeting attendance, could that be redone? I would like to know if there is a possibility of having only In Person meetings.

Director Mazzorato: Trustees would be aware that the Regulation associated with attendance at Board and Standing Committee meetings was changed during the pandemic to allow for exclusively virtual attendance. In late fall, the Regulation was lifted such that meetings are to return to pre-pandemic operations.

The Regulation requires that the Chair of the Board/Standing Committee (or designate) and the Director of Education (or designate) are present in the board room. This means that if the Chair cannot be present, he/she can designate another individual to be in the board room. The same is true for the Director. If the Director cannot be present, he/she can designate another individual to be present in the board room.

Other than meeting this requirement, trustees can choose to attend either in person or virtually.

7. Trustee Herman Vioria: Are we prepared to fill any vacant administrator positions with the likelihood of more retirements announced for June 2023?

Director Mazzorato: We continue to be in a situation of trying to catch up on administrator vacancies. We have not minimized the challenge of encouraging leadership. We are willing to provide the Catholic Leadership Qualification Process when candidates come forward for mentorship. We are grateful to retirees for filling the gaps as needed.

8. Trustee Herman Vioria: School communities are not happy to have retirees fill the gaps. Can staff provide the numbers of candidates in the Principal/Vice-Principal (P/VP) pool?

Director Mazzorato: We understand. The ideal is that we would have permanent administrators in place. However, we continue to use every strategy available to mentor and encourage candidates to consider leadership.

Associate Director Amaral: We will provide information on the P/VP pool in Issues and Events.

9. Trustee Herman Vioria: Do we do an exit survey with administrators?

Director Mazzorato: As per the three retirement letters received tonight, many administrators have worked for Dufferin-Peel for many years, and some well beyond their retirement eligibility.

10. Trustee Mario Pascucci: Parents/guardians have raised the issue of lack of continuity in administration at some schools. Is it possible to provide trustees with talking points on the



shortage of administrators, understanding that this is an issue province-wide and not just in DPCDSB?

Director Mazzorato: We will provide in an upcoming Issues and Events.

11. Trustee Paula Dametto-Giovanozzi: At one of my Orangeville schools a bus routes is late every Tuesday at the end of the day (route 652), delays as long as 75 minutes. Is there a solution?

Superintendent Thomas: We have followed up with Principal Maiolo and Superintendent Kuran. The bus operator acknowledged that there have been challenges and adjustments have been made to the run. Driver retention has been a challenge province-wide and has been amplified due to the pandemic. Drivers do work a split shift, two hours in the morning and two hours in the afternoon, based on the funding model provided by the Ministry. Drivers do sign on to work split shift, however some drivers leave for better hours, better pay or new opportunities.

12. Trustee Paula Dametto-Giovanozzi: As per my earlier good news report, the Social Networking Security presentation by Paul Davis was exceptional. This presentation was paid for by the school, would the board consider paying for this to be presented in the evening for a larger audience?

Director Mazzorato: We will pass this information on to the Central Committee for Catholic School Councils (CCCSC) as they consider Parent Engagement opportunities.

*Trustee Thomas Thomas joined the meeting virtually at 8:08 p.m.*

13. Trustee Mario Pascucci: Can staff provide information on what is being done regarding the recent coyote sightings? I understand that this is a city issue.

Superintendent Thomas: We are working with the Municipal and Rural Affairs staff. They are trying to redirect the migration of coyotes. General Manager Campbell works with the municipalities whenever an issue arises to communicate to school communities. We acknowledge the challenge; administrators are doing their best to ensure the safety of staff and students. Public information to not feed the coyotes is very important.

14. Trustee Stefano Pascucci: Can staff advise if elementary administrators are collaborating with secondary administrators to host graduations at secondary schools?

Director Mazzorato: We continue to promote the use of secondary schools for Grade 8 Graduations.

15. Trustee Stefano Pascucci: Is there an update on the cafeteria provider?

Executive Superintendent Cherepacha: All secondary school cafeterias provide food service in some capacity from grab-and-go to full service. The Request for Proposals (RFP) will be going out shortly with the intention of having providers in place for July 2023. The steering committee has had input into the process and specifications, and we have had a presentation to trustees regarding the document. The RFP will be open for 30 days to receive bids.

16. Trustee Brea Corbet: Thank you Trustee Bruno Iannicca for organizing the Human Trafficking event, is this a CCCSC event?

Trustee Bruno Iannicca: This is a CCCSC event and has been made possible with the help and coordination of the Peel Regional Police, myself, Superintendent Brunton and the two engaged guest speakers.

Director Mazzorato: As this is a CCCSC event for all of DPCDSB, we will communicate broadly. It will be held virtually in an effort to engage as many parents/guardians as possible.

17. Trustee Shawn Xaviour: Is it possible to have school choirs sing and videotape the National Anthem to open some of our Board Meetings?

Director Mazzorato: Good idea, we will review.
