4 INQUIRY QUESTIONS FOR SELF-EXPLORATION

What are my opportunities? (e.g., school and community-based opportunities)

Who do I want to become? (e.g., personal and academic goal setting)

What is my plan for achieving my goals? (e.g., create a plan, identify resources required, potential obstacles and challenges they may encounter)
