

In order to lesson the stress at the end of the project term, we are chunking the expectations. The community project will continue to be developed throughout all of the months, but the process for Criterion A is now complete and can be documented in the final presentation format.

Presentation Requirements:

Note: While all of the sub-categories must be represented in the presentation, this is NOT a list to check off. Guiding questions and comments are simply provided as a launching point. Some will fit, and some will not, and may have other points of your own.

1. Project goal / project title

2. Conceptual question – What were you hoping to accomplish / identify through this project
 - Must be tied to one of the 16 key concepts
 - Could be developed through the support of your supervisor
 - *e.g., How do volunteer programs support the physical and mental well-being and development of children?*

3. Rationale
 - Why did you select this topic – be thorough in your reasoning
 - What sparked your curiosity / inspired you to go this route
 - What type of project is it (e.g., direct, indirect, research, advocacy, a mix)
 - Where is the need? (school, local, provincial, global) – why did you select something at this level vs. the others?

4. Global Context
 - Select one GC and one connected exploration point
 - Identify how it explicitly connects to your overall goal
 - Outline why you selected that particular one
