‘Come! Do not be afraid.’ Peter’s response is worthy of our attention: ‘Peter had to leave the ship and risk his life on the sea, in order to learn both his own weakness and the almighty power of his Lord. If Peter had not taken the risk, he would never have learned the meaning of faith. The road to faith passes through obedience to the call of Jesus.

I hope and pray that this will come to pass according to God’s wisdom and God’s time. Hang on to Jesus. He whispers to our ears: ‘Do not be afraid.’

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

To celebrate the Virtues, we gather together as a community to celebrate our faith. Through daily prayer, monthly newsletters, staff weekly memos and conversations, we communicate openly our call to model and live the Virtues. Through the student leadership, the Youth Faith Ambassadors lead students through virtual prepared liturgies. We therefore share in communal prayer and are aware of how the Virtues are evidenced in the school and in our community.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

As you enter St. John Fisher school, you will see an Altar adorned with a bible and crucifix. Items representing the Liturgical Calendar are also placed on the Altar. A Staff member has taken the responsibility to change the colors of the altar cloth to match the Liturgical Calendar seasons (Advent, Lent, Ordinary Time etc.). Each classroom has been given the various colors of the altar cloth as well to adorn their own sacred space. Our Virtue posters and the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations banner are also visible in the front foyer.
