R.J. McCARTHY SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO NATIONAL BOOK AWARD

THE ART STEFFLER MEMORIAL AWARD

THE EDWARD KING MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. King was founding principal of St. Martin Secondary School and Father Michael Goetz Secondary School.

FATHER MICHAEL GOETZ MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
