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## St. Martin Textbook/Learning Material Drop off

Dear St. Martin Families,

As always, I hope this email finds you well and staying safe.

As we approach the end of Quadmester 2 and the beginning of Quadmester 3 (February 2<sup>nd</sup>), we need to plan for the retrieval of textbooks and learning materials.

To that end, we will be collecting textbooks/materials:

- **Thursday, January 28<sup>th</sup> – 10:30am – 12:00pm for students with last names A – F**
- **Thursday, January 28<sup>th</sup> – 12:00pm – 1:30pm for students with last names G – K**
  
- **Friday, January 29<sup>th</sup> – 10:30am – 12:00pm for students with last names L – Q**
- **Friday, January 29<sup>th</sup> – 12:00pm – 1:30pm for students with last names R – Z**

Recognizing individual circumstances, as well as final course assessments, we want to provide as much flexibility as possible for students/parents to drop off course materials.

**Weather permitting, tables will be set up outside the main school doors for drop-off. In case of inclement weather, we will collect returns at the front door.**

**Individuals should not come to drop off any items if they are feeling unwell.**

<p><b>Dropping off textbooks and other Items</b></p> <p>Students are asked to drop off any outstanding items (textbooks, instruments, other resources) outside the front doors on the tables.</p> <p><b>Before returning the item to the school.</b></p> <p><b>All items must be labelled at home with the student's name and teacher's name (using masking tape on the front or a post-it note inside)</b></p>	<p>We will have designated markers where individuals can drop off items.</p> <p>Individuals must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <u>Physically distance</u></li><li>• <u>Wear masks</u> while on school property.</li></ul> <p><u>Social gathering of any kind on school property will not be permitted</u> during this process. Students and families will be required to leave the school property immediately after they have dropped off their items.</p>
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Given that students may be in transit for part of the day (to and from school), class content would be **asynchronous**. This means that there would be no live lesson; instead, teachers would post the lesson for that period. Classroom teachers will confirm with students when this will occur (and it may be different from one class to the next depending on final course assessments) but students should have an opportunity to drop off textbooks during at least one of the two days.

We also understand that some students (or their parents) may not be able to come to the school during these times, or at all, for various reasons. If the students return to school by early February (as per the Government's original announcement), then we will distribute textbooks and resources when students (in Cohorts A and B) return to the physical building and we will arrange a separate pick-up for Cohort C.

If the return-to-school date is extended, we will share a plan for pick-up of resources for all students.
