### How to Register – Dufferin Peel CDSB STUDENTS

#### REGISTRATION PROCESS:

All students wishing to take a summer school course: Must FULLY complete the [registration request](#) form or the QR code

- Registration requests will be forwarded to their Guidance Counsellor for review and approval
- Registration requests will be processed only after the Guidance Counsellor approval is received
- Deadline for all approved registration forms is **June 5, 2024 @12:00 noon.**
- Students are strongly encouraged to register as soon as possible as limited space is available.

#### Cancellation of Courses

- Courses run pending enrolment
- Students will receive emails if the course has been cancelled or location changed
- Confirmation emails are sent to applicants' email on file

- ✓ Adult and Continuing Education will contact students only if the course has been cancelled OR if there is a location change

**ELIGIBLE STUDENTS:** Students must be currently enrolled in a Secondary School program for admission to the Secondary Summer School Program, July 2024. The student must have the required prerequisite (where necessary).
