Credit Counselling Summary (CCS)

The Credit Counselling Summary report provides you with a list of credits and marks you have earned. You can use this report to track your progress and ensure that you are fulfilling all the credit requirements needed to graduate. A summary of the compulsory and elective credits you have achieved, your documented community involvement hours and the completion of the Ontario Secondary Literacy Test is provided on this report. The sample below highlights the main features of the CCS for a student who has completed grade 9:
