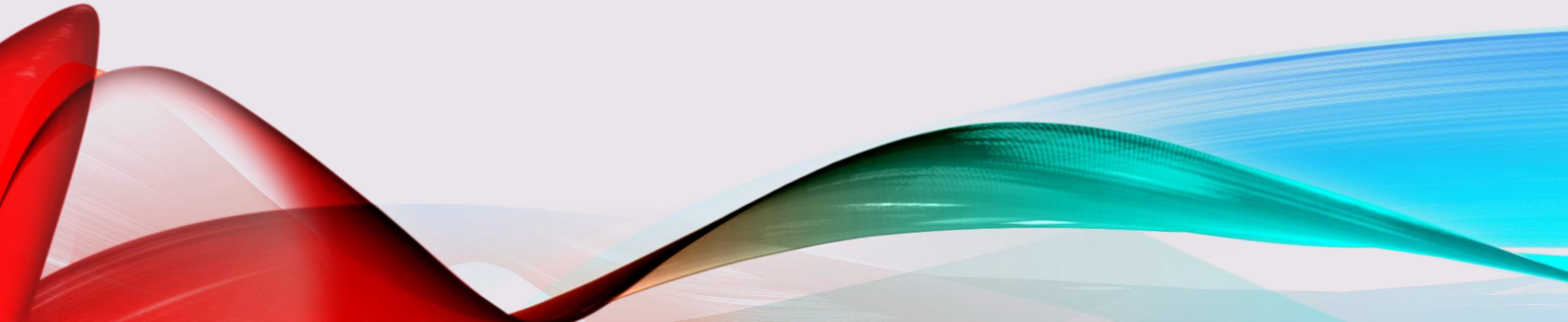

WHAT LEVEL DO I TAKE FOR GRADE 10?



ENGLISH

ENG2D1- Academic

- Some OSSLT preparation
- Readings include poems, short stories, 1-2 novel studies, and Shakespeare (readings are completely independent)
- 2-3 major essay/long writing assignments, 3-4 major tests
- Best suited for students who consistently earned a level three or four in grade 9 English

ENG2P1- Applied

- Extensive OSSLT preparation
- Various short text selections including high interest stories, news articles, biographies, one novel and one graphic novel (readings teacher led)
- One major essay, Short writing responses, Creating info-graphics, 2-3 major tests
- Students who earned 65% or less in grade 9 English may consider this as an option to have greater success.

ENG2L1- Locally Developed

- Teacher led, lots of one on one help
- If you took ENG1L1, this is the course you should be selecting

MATH

MPM2D1 - Academic

- enjoyed grade 9 and was able to keep up with homework, material & pacing
- looking for more theoretical examples and how those theories fit into our every world
- looking to pursue a post-secondary area in a math based program (eg. Engineering, medical, computer science, business)

MFM2P1 - Applied

- had some challenges with grade 9 (concepts, pacing)
- looking for examples that are more based in real world scenarios
- slower paced with less material covered
- looking to pursue a post-secondary area that is NOT rooted in mathematics

MAT2L1 - Locally Developed

- Hands-on activities, practical everyday math
- If you took MAT1L1 you should be selecting this

SCIENCE

SNC2D1 - Academic

- Is quite dense with content and is very fast paced
- Requires thorough understanding of the grade 9 chemistry and the critical thinking, analysis and math done, especially, in the current electricity part of the course.
- If a student was already struggling with these in grade 9, grade 10 academic level will also be a struggle

SNC2P1 - Applied

- Did you struggle with the content (especially the chemistry and the physics parts) of the grade 9 science course?
- The grade 10 applied course allows for a slower progression through similar content

SVN3E1 - Workplace

- If you took SNC1L1 this is the course for grade 10.
- If you struggled greatly in de-streamed grade 9 and you have no intention of taking science after grade 10, you can take this course

Description

This course introduces basic features of the function by extending students' experiences with quadratic relations. It focuses on quadratic, trigonometric, and exponential functions and their use in modelling real-world situations. Students will represent functions numerically, graphically, and algebraically; simplify expressions; solve equations; and solve problems relating to applications. Students will reason mathematically and communicate their thinking as they solve multi-step problems. This course will help students address the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectation that they adopt a holistic approach to life by integrating learning from various subject areas and experience
