# CERTIFICATION PROCESS

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- can begin in high school (Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program - OYAP)
- most require the OSSD
- “earn and learn” on the job training
- 90% on-the-job learning & 10% in-school
- licenced employer trains you
- certification exam
- usually takes 4 years to complete
- You can apply to an apprenticeship/pre-apprenticeship program at a college or private colleges

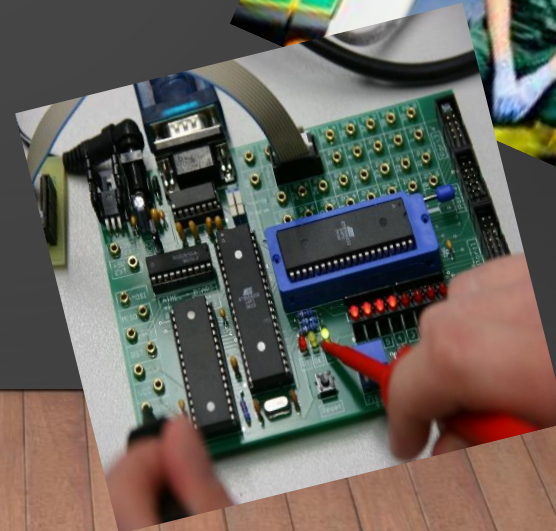

# ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- OSSD
- Gr. 11 & 12 college/mixed/university prep courses for diploma and certificate programs
- Applied Degree programs ENG4U1 plus 5 other grade 12 U/M level courses
- Admission average is based on senior (gr. 11 & 12) marks including program pre-requisites

# PRE-REQUISITE EXAMPLES

- **Grade 12 English** mark is always used in the admission average and....
- Possible additional requirements for various diploma programs
  - Business...4C or 4U math
  - Computer Programmer...4C or 4U math
  - Fire Fighting...SCH3U or SCH4C, 4C or 4U math
  - Medical Technology...SBI3C, SCH4C, math

# ADDITIONAL ADMISSION CRITERIA

- portfolio or audition
- admission test (English, Math, Science)
- interview
- written profile
- immunization or criminal reference check

# UNIVERSITY VOCABULARY

- ❑ Faculty- the broad area of interest you want to study
- ❑ Degree- is awarded when a student completes their university program
- ❑ Major & Minor– the specific courses you take related to your areas of interest
- ❑ Required Courses – must be included in your program
- ❑ Elective Courses – are courses that you can choose to complete your program

# UNIVERSITY ADMISSIONS

- OSSD
- SIX grade 12 university (4U) or university/college (4M) courses
- Specific subject prerequisites
- Supplemental applications

## PRE- REQUISITES EXAMPLES

### **Grade 12 English (ENG4U) is required for all programs**

- Arts...
  - ENG4U and next top 5 U/M courses
- Business...
  - 1 or 2 grade 12 math courses (one should be Advanced Functions)
- Science....
  - usually at least 2 of the three sciences (SBI4U, SCH4U, SPH4U)
  - Advanced Functions
  - many require Calculus & Vectors
- Fine Arts...
  - audition or portfolio

## REQUIRED VS RECOMMENDED

- Required:
  - you must have the course to be considered for the program
  - will be calculated in the average of your six
- Recommended:
  - a good idea
  - will not be counted if it is not in your top six
  - may need upgrading course in university

# APPLICATION PROCESS

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Apply on-line to the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC)



Apply by early January of Grade 12



Begin with 3 program choices



Early *conditional* offers may be based on grade 11 marks



Regular offers are based on grade 12 marks (first semester final 2<sup>nd</sup> semester midterm)


