I am writing to inform you that Peel Public Health is currently investigating a COVID-19 exposure at St. Elizabeth Seton Catholic Elementary School.

If you have not been contacted by Peel Public Health, this means your routine does not need to change. Individuals who have been notified by Peel Public Health are advised to get tested. Peel Public Health has informed us that the risk for the rest of our school remains low.

Our school is open for children and staff. Additional cleaning has taken place. Our physical distancing, hand washing/sanitizing and mask rules help prevent spread and lower risk as well as daily COVID-19 self-screening and verification. Peel Public Health will let us know if additional measures are needed to reduce the risk of transmission.
